



The Old Rock Cafe

Chimney Rock has stood as a sentinel over beautiful Hickory Nut Gorge for countless centuries, inspiring wonder, generating legends & provoking courageous (and outrageous!) acts of daredevilry from the earliest civilizations until the present time. For over a century, it was well-loved and cared for by the Morse family who, through four generations, saw the Rock and its 1000-acre environs as something to be preserved, maintained and shared with all who wish to enjoy it. The bridge over the Rocky Broad River, the winding road to the incredible elevator which rises through solid granite, trails to and from the waterfall and all other guest-friendly improvements in the Park have been designed to provide access for young and old alike. Though the Rock itself is virtually changeless, people's tastes certainly are not. Over the years various means of inviting the public to share in this scenic wonderland have been employed and all give evidence of the style du jour. Some of the old ads and photos seem funny to us today, but they were quite acceptable and in vogue when they were created. We thought we'd like to share some of this 'old-timey' art with you, the sophisticated consumers of the

21st century. And now, the rest of the story:
996-acre Chimney Rock Park - and the Old Rock were sold to the state of North Carolina in 2007 to
become the centerpiece of the still-developing
greater Chimney Rock State Park. Today, Chimney
Rock State Park comprises over 6,000 acres and is
still growing.
